## Key takeaways

- **Core DNA**—vision, multistakeholder ethos, digital-divide focus, human-rights recognition, IGF renewal—remains intact.
- **Strategic upgrades** come in the form of the GDC linkage, a quality-of-access paradigm (“meaningful connectivity”), and brand-new clusters on AI, data governance, the digital economy, and environmental sustainability.
- **Noticeable gaps:** an explicit WSIS Forum role, concrete financing mechanisms (Digital Solidarity Fund, IGF budget), a roadmap for enhanced cooperation, and any tailored language on Arabic digital presence or multilingual AI—all areas where the Arab bloc can press for insertions as the Zero Draft is negotiated.



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
