5 headline takeaways

Almost 70 % overlap in core principles

- Both reaffirm WSIS legacy, SDG link, multistakeholder model, IGF renewal and the need to close divides.

Directive vs. consultative tone

- CSTD text is prescriptive ("Requests the SG...").
- Elements Paper is exploratory ("Feedback invited on...").
- → Final Zero Draft must merge CSTD's operative verbs with Elements' new policy space.

Six brand-new policy domains appear only in the Elements Paper

(Digital economy, Social-cultural, Environment, Data Governance, AI, Capacity-building).

- Opportunity for Arab bloc to inject Arabic-content, AI-compute equity, green-tech finance.

Metrics & monitoring gap

- Only Elements Paper introduces *meaningful-connectivity* indicators; CSTD text still counts connections.
- Annual SG-report cadence appears only in CSTD.
- → Need to weld both into a single monitoring article.

Financing & IGF funding unresolved

- Both documents note resource gaps; neither proposes a concrete mechanism (Digital Solidarity Fund revival, Arab Digital Capacity Fund, stable IGF budget).

What the Elements Paper ADDS (not found in the April CSTD draft) concise list of brand-new angles or language additions we may want to support or refine, when drafting Arab inputs to the Zero Draft.

1. Five fresh thematic clusters

- Digital Economy (platform work, MSME e-trade, digital-tax fairness)
- Social & Cultural Development (digital public goods, cultural-diversity safeguards)
- Environmental Impacts (ICT carbon footprint, e-waste, circular economy)
- Data Governance (interoperable, rights-based data frameworks)
- Artificial Intelligence (compute inequity, generative-AI risks, governance gap)
- 2. "Meaningful, affordable access" metric calls for composite indicators (speed, cost-of-income, safety, local content).
- **3. Internet-fragmentation warning** explicit risk language absent from CSTD text.
- 4. Draft UN Cybercrime Convention (2024) reference under confidence & security.
- 5. Targeted AI / data-centre financing ask in the Financial Mechanisms cluster.
- **6. Information-integrity** / **deep-fake ethics** under Human-Rights cluster.
- 7. Open solicitation of stakeholder feedback on every cluster (consultative tone).

What the Elements Paper OMITS (present in the April CSTD draft)

omissions you may wish to re-insert when drafting Arab inputs to the Zero Draft.

- 1. Operative mandates CSTD's forceful verbs ("Requests", "Urges") are replaced by open questions.
- 2. Annual Secretary-General WSIS progress report & Geneva/New-York open consultations.
- 3. Explicit citation of GA AI resolutions 78/265 & 78/311 (only appear in CSTD preamble).
- 4. Strong journalist-safety clause found in CSTD human-rights section.
- **5. Concrete IGF-funding appeal** (CSTD asks SG to mobilise resources; Elements silent).
- 6. Instruction to embed GDC commitments into Action-Line facilitators' workplans (Elements keeps alignment generic).
- 7. Reference to the WSIS Forum as the annual implementation platform.
- **8. CSTD Working-Group history on Enhanced Co-operation** (Elements notes the debate but not the WG record).

Suggested next steps for the Arab consultative meeting
